I. MORTIFIED (ADJ)

• Definition:

a feeling of extreme embarrassment, shame or humiliation

- Synonym: embarrassed, ashamed Antonym: proud, undisturbed
- Sentence: Jane felt mortified when she realized she had mistakenly sent an email meant for her friend to her entire office, leading to an awkward situation during the team meeting.

2. PROFICIENCY (NOUN)

- Definition:
 a high degree of competence or skill
- Synonym: capability, competence Antonym: incapability, incompetence
- Sentence: After years of practice, Sarah attained proficiency in playing the piano, impressing audiences with her skillful performances.

3. EXCERPT (NOUN)

• Definition:

A short extract from film, literature, a piece of music or writing

- Synonym: quotation, segment Antonym: entirety, whole
- Sentence: The teacher read an excerpt from the novel to illustrate the author's use of symbolism in storytelling.

4. JEOPARDIZE (VERB)

• Definition:

To put someone or something in a situation where there is danger, loss, or harm

- Synonym: endanger, risk Antonym: protect, secure
- Sentence: Speeding through the red light could jeopardize not only your safety but also the safety of others on the road.

5. PHILANTHROPY (NOUN)

• Definition:

The desire to promote the well-being of others, especially by the generous donations of money to good causes

- Synonym: charity, generosity Antonym: selfishness, greed
- Sentence: The billionaire's philanthropy has funded numerous education and healthcare initiatives around the world, improving the lives of countless individuals.

6. SUBLIMINALLY (ADVERB)

• Definition:

Below the threshold of sensation or consciousness; affecting someone's mind without them being aware of it

• Synonym: indirectly, implicitly, subtly Antonym: openly, obviously

• Sentence:

The advertisement used subliminally embedded messages to influence consumer behavior without their explicit knowledge.

7. FALTER (VERB)

• Definition:

To start to lose strength or momentum; to hesitate

- Synonym: fumble, halt Antonym: proceed, persist
- Sentence:

Despite her initial confidence, her voice began to falter as she struggled to express her thoughts in front of the audience.

8. INTEGRATE (VERB)

• Definition:

To bring together, unite or combine.

- Synonym: incorporate, unify Antonym: separate, divide
- Sentence: The school implemented a new program to integrate students from different cultural backgrounds, fostering diversity and inclusivity within the student body.

9. LUCRATIVE (ADJECTIVE)

• Definition:

something that leads to/provides good results or profit

- Synonym: profitable, worthwhile Antonym: unprofitable, unrewarding
- Sentence: The entrepreneur launched a new venture in the tech. industry, hoping it would prove to be lucrative and bring substantial profits in the coming years.
