LESSON FOUR

I. OMEN (NOUN)

- Definition: an event that is believed to bring good or evil in the future
- Synonym: foreshadowing, premonition, hint Antonym: outcome, result
- Sentence: The sudden appearance of a black cat crossing our path was seen as an omen of bad luck for the journey ahead.

2. RAPPORT (NOUN)

• Definition: a positive relation or connection with someone else

Synonym: bond, connection

Antonym: incompatibility, disconnection

• Sentence: Despite just meeting, the two immediately found common ground and established a natural rapport, making their conversation flow effortlessly.

3. IMPARTIAL (ADJECTIVE)

Definition: not biased; fair and just

• Synonym: unbiased, equal, fair

Antonym: biased, unfair

• Sentence:

The judge remained impartial throughout the trial, carefully weighing all evidence and arguments presented by both the prosecution and the defense.

4. INFANTILE (ADJECTIVE)

Definition: child-like or immature behaviour

• Synonym: childish, juvenile, immature

Antonym: mature, sophisticated

• Sentence:

The teenager's constant need for attention and tantrums over minor issues were seen as infantile behavior by her peers.

5. SQUANDER (VERB)

• Definition: to spend or use (time, money, etc.) extravagantly or wastefully

• Synonym: misuse, waste

Antonym: save, accumulate

Sentence:

Despite his parents' warnings, he continued to squander his allowance on frivolous purchases, leaving him with little money for essential items.

6. PATRON (NOUN)

Definition: A person who supports (with money, gifts, endorsements, etc.)
 an artist, charity, museum, business, or special cause

• Synonym: customer, sponsor

Antonym: opponent, detractor

• Sentence:

As a loyal patron of the arts, she frequently attended gallery openings and supported local artists by purchasing their work.

7. INCOHERENT (ADJECTIVE)

• Definition: Unable to speak intelligently; not making sense

Synonym: illogical, disjointed

Antonym: understandable, logical

Sentence:

The speech he gave was so incoherent that many audience members struggled to understand his main points.

8. PERTINENT (ADJECTIVE)

• Definition: relevant or important to a particular matter

• Synonym: related, appropriate, significant

Antonym: unrelated, irrelevant, insignificant

• Sentence:

The questions raised by the detective were pertinent to the ongoing investigation, shedding light on crucial aspects of the case.

9. NICHE (NOUN)

- Definition:
 a position or place considered most suitable or appropriate for a person or thing
- Synonym: specialization, role, compartment Antonym: mainstream, generalization
- Sentence: The small bakery found its niche in the community by specializing in gluten-free pastries, attracting a loyal customer base of people with dietary restrictions.
