

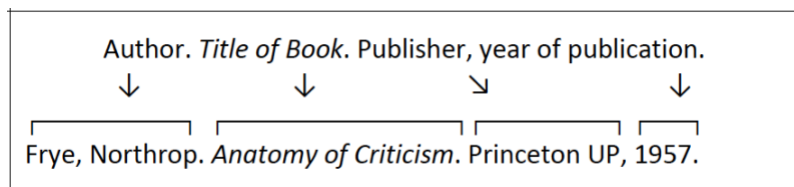
How to Write a List of References & Sources in MLA

Your list of references & sources should include the following formatting rules:

- Provide as much information as possible.
- Your list of references & sources should be given a title.
- All sources should be listed in alphabetical order.
- Names of Authors should be written in reverse order: Last Name, First Name.
- If there is no author name or date provided, write no name / no date.
- Dates are written day, month, year (e.g. 31 October 2021).
- Capitalize all key words provided in the source.
- Leave a space between each source.
- For online sources, always include the date you accessed the source.

For specific rules on formatting, follow the examples below:

Books/Stories:



Images/Video:

Format:

"Title of Image/Video." *Title of Website*, date of image/video, website link. Date Accessed.

Examples:

"Hello Kitty." *Sanrio*, no date, www.sanrio.com/collections/hello-kitty. Date Accessed: 15 November 2021.

"Vancouver Skyline." *Daily Hive*, 26 April 2019, www.dailyhive.com/10-best-vancouver-skyline-locations. Date Accessed: 15 November 2021.

Entire Website:

Format:

Title of Website, publishing date, website link. Date Accessed.

Example:

Hugh McRoberts Secondary School Athletics, September 2020, www.mcroberts.sd38.bc.ca/extra-curricular/athletics.
Date Accessed: 15 November 2021.

Online Writing Lab, no date, www.owl.purdue.edu/research/mla_formatting_style_guide.html.
Date Accessed: 15 November 2021.

Specific Article on a Website:

Format:

Author. "Title of Article." *Title of Website*, date of article, website link. Date Accessed.

Example:

Baker, Meredith. "Tips For Being a Great Blogger." *Wordpress*, 19 July 2019, www.meredith.wolfwater.com/wordpress/tips-for-being-a-great-blogger. Date Accessed: 15 November 2021.

Jones, Shane. "McDavid Provides More Magic to Propel Oilers Past Jets in Shootout." *CBC News*, 12 November 2021, www.cbc.ca/sports/hockey/nhl/nhl-edmonton-oilers-winnipeg-jets-recap-nov-10. Date Accessed: 15 November 2021.

***REMEMBER to include In-Text Citations ↴

When quoting or paraphrasing specific information from an outside source, you also need to provide an in-text citation. This should include the author's name or the title of the website and the year. Again, provide as much information as possible. **(Author's Name, Year)** or **(Website, Year)**.

Example:

Jack Pinter, Senior Environmental Engineer on the project, has stated that "because of the recent construction of the Little Dam further up the river, the Center Street Dam is no longer necessary" **(Des Moines Register, 2016)**.
