# embroil (verb)

definition: to involve deeply in an argument or conflict synonym: snarl/ensnare antonym: exclude/uncomplicate sentence: The warring neighbors were embroiled in a lengthy lawsuit.

#### petulance (noun)

definition: angriness; foul mood synonym: grouchiness/surliness antonym: happiness/generosity sentence: The nanny, who could no longer stand the child's petulance, resigned.

### bristle (verb)

definition: to react defensively, typically by drawing back synonym: withdraw/flinch antonym: attack/pounce sentence: During the dinner party, my mother bristled at my father's rude remark.

#### respite (n.)

definition: a short period of rest during a difficult task synonym: break/recess antonym: beginning/continuation sentence: Spring break is a welcomed respite before the intensity of final exams.

### robust (adj.)

definition: strong and healthy synonym: vigorous/powerful antonym: weak/meek sentence: In the past four years, the economy has grown from weak to robust.

## opulent (adj.)

definition: showing great wealth and luxury synonym: lavish/sumptuous antonym: poor/destitute sentence: The prom couples enjoyed the opulent comfort of their limousine.

#### resplendent (adj.)

definition: beautiful, bright

synonym: radiant, dazzling, gorgeous

antonym: dull, gloomy

sentence: The girl looked resplendent in her

sea green gown.

# pragmatic (adj.)

definition: in a way that is sensible and reasonable

synonym: logical/efficient

antonym: impractical/fanciful

sentence: Steve Jobs' preference for jeans and black turtlenecks was

certainly pragmatic.

### debunk (verb)

definition: to show the falseness or hollowness of an idea synonym: expose/disprove antonym: confirm/uphold sentence: The stars of the television show Mythbusters take great joy in debunking urban legends.
